

Roulette



Originally a French game, Roulette was made famous in Monte Carlo and is now played extensively throughout the world. You can play this fascinating game a number of ways, but the basics are easy to learn.

The main objective of the game is: To place a bet on a number or section of numbers. The Roulette game has 38 numbers; 1 to 36, plus a 0 and 00. The ball is spun and if it lands in a number that you bet on, you win. It's That Simple!

Roulette chips are of various colors to differentiate each player's chips. You set their value when you buy a stack or "color" at the table. Or, you may also play with regular casino chips ranging from \$1 to \$5.

Each spin of the wheel is a new game, with the dealer turning the wheel, then spinning the small ball in the opposite direction. Players may place bets until the dealer calls, "no more bets." When the ball comes to rest, the dealer marks the winning number and bets are collected and paid in accordance with the odds.

Players are responsible for the correct position of their wagers on the layout regardless of whether the bets are placed by the dealer. Dealers will be happy to explain the placement of any bets.

ROULETTE BETS AND THEIR ODDS

STRAIGHT UP
Any single number (Including 0 & 00)
35 to 1

SPLIT COMBINATION BET
Pays off if either of the two numbers bet is spun
17 to 1

CORNER COMBINATION BET
Pays off if any of the four numbers forming the corner is spun
8 to 1

COLUMN BET
Pays off if any of the 12 numbers in the column bet is spun
2 to 1

LINE COMBINATION BET
Pays off if any of the six numbers in the two rows bet is spun
5 to 1

DOZEN
Pays off if 1 through 12, 13 through 24, or 25 through 36 is spun, depending on the dozen bet
2 to 1

TOP LINE COMBINATION BET
Pays off if 0, 00, 1, 2, or 3 is spun
6 to 1

RED OR BLACK
Pays off if the color on the number spun corresponds to the color bet
1 to 1

ODD OR EVEN
Pays off if winning number corresponds to the bet made
1 to 1

I TO 18 OR 19 TO 36
Pays off if number spun falls within the range indicated
1 to 1

STREET COMBINATION BET
Pays off if any of the three numbers in the row bet is spun
11 to 1
